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Prizes & Scholarships Policy

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1 INTRODUCTION

Prizes and Scholarships at SPW are of historical significance and from both St Peter's Anglican Grammar and Woodlands Girls School. Whilst the prizes remain, the criteria have changed to reflect SPW as a primary school, with a strong academic and service component.

2 SCOPE


This policy applies to SPW staff and students. This policy covers prizes and scholarships presented at the annual ceremonies held at the end of the school year, and other bursaries which may be awarded on other occasions. This document also outlines a brief history of the awards including former criteria or titles.

3 OBJECTIVES

- To catalogue the prizes awarded and the criteria by which each is awarded.
- To catalogue the scholarships on offer at SPW and the criteria by which they are awarded,
- To document the history behind each prize/scholarship, including the person/s they are named for or who support the prize/scholarship.
- To give an overview of the administration around the awarding, presentation, and maintenance of the prizes/scholarships.

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10 SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS

At the commencement of Term 4, class, year level, and specialist staff are provided with a criteria to consider for the specific awards. Data and information is collected (anecdotal, results class based, NAPLAN, etc) by the staff member and supplied to the Deputy Principal with the nominated student for collation. The Principal and Deputy Principal review the document for final authorisation.

All Scholarships are for entrance only and an application form must be submitted. This form is available from the Principal.

Award recipients' names are displayed on the relevant honour boards in Law Smith building. These boards are updated annually, managed by the Development Office.
